- The Senators successfully secured \$1,594,355 to support An Achievable Dream (ADD) in Newport News, Virginia Beach, and Henrico County. These funds will support hiring additional student enrichment and support staff, including a dedicated trauma informed counselor, additional hands-on learning and social skills development, extended hours and learning supports, and an expanded suite of emergency wrap-around supports for students and families.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,529,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the Virginia Foundation for Community College Education to provide support to 384 early childhood educators in Virginia to participate in degree, credential, or certification programs at their local community college over a two-year period.
- The Senators successfully secured \$977,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the
 Communities in Schools (CIS) of Virginia COVID-19 Re-Engagement Initiative—a statewide
 initiative to augment CIS' existing wraparound supports for students by providing 11 additional
 personnel to assist those most likely to drop out by building personal relationships and
 establishing individualized goals.
- The Senators successfully secured \$899,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the Foundation for Community College Education to enhance coaching, outreach, and work-based learning opportunities for individuals across Virginia who have experienced foster care.
- The Senators successfully secured \$885,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for the Virginia
 Center for Hospital-Based Violence Intervention which is establishing national centers of
 excellence for Virginia health systems to address community violence in Roanoke,
 Fredericksburg, Petersburg, Bristol, Hampton, Portsmouth, and Danville.
- The Senators successfully secured \$352,000 in the Senate appropriations bill for Source for Learning, Inc. to support their efforts to expand online professional learning and resource offerings to early childhood educators in Virginia.
- The Senators successfully secured \$169,000 in the Senate appropriations bill to aid the Virginia Health Workforce Development Authority's efforts to train 100 Community Health Workers with a specific focus on providing mental health services in rural Virginia.
