## 2022 Congressionally Designated Spending Dollars for The Shenandoah Valley



## U.S. Senators Mark R. Warner and Tim Kaine

- Following Warner and Kaine's joint request, \$3,600,000 is headed to Frederick County to support the Frederick County Sanitation Authority's development of a well and treatment plant, which will provide an independent water source within the local community. This project will improve water reliability and increase overall system capacity to a part of the County currently supplied by a five-mile pipeline with no redundant pipes or backup water sources.
- Following Kaine's request, \$620,000 is headed to Harrisonburg to help support James
  Madison University's teacher residency program, which is facilitated by the University's
  College of Education. Senator Kaine's <u>PREP Act</u> encourages school districts to create
  partnerships, including Grow Your Own programs, with local community colleges and
  universities to ensure their programs are educating future teachers in areas where there is a
  shortage of educators.
