- The Senators successfully secured \$3,000,000 for the City of Virginia Beach to build a Critical Operations Facility to house staff and personnel during normal daily operations and during natural disasters and emergencies in the preparation, monitoring, and recovery stages of an event in Virginia Beach.
- The Senators successfully secured \$2,000,000 for the City of Hampton to develop a feasibility level design for a floodgate and pump station at Tide Mill Lane that will help protect access to and from Langley Air Force Base during flood conditions. The project will mitigate the effects of climate change, sea level rise, and extreme weather events on the base and reduce the risk of coastal flooding in adjacent neighborhoods.
- The Senators successfully secured \$2,000,000 for Horizon Health Services to upgrade its Waverly Medical Center in Sussex County to enhance care and expand services to include dental and behavioral health practices.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,428,000 for YWCA South Hampton Roads in Norfolk to develop and support a new business incubator model for women-owned businesses to help small businesses grow in Virginia.
- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for the Hampton University School of Nursing in Hampton City to purchase equipment for a simulation center to improve health care worker education and training.
- The Senators successfully secured \$625,000 for Virginia Wesleyan University to establish a Center for Career Development & Neurodiversity in Virginia Beach, which would work to provide an accessible and inclusive experience that prepares students with autism for good jobs.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for the College of William & Mary in Williamsburg City to support students in gaining experience with the federal government and military agencies prior to graduation through paid internships.
- The Senators successfully secured \$500,000 for Old Dominion University to launch a program that accelerates the establishment, certification, success, and growth of veteran entrepreneurial businesses in the **Hampton Roads** region.
- The Senators successfully secured \$498,000 for the Hampton Roads Community Action Program, Inc. to expand the Whole Family Initiative, a program that provides child care and employment services to parents in Newport News, Hampton, Norfolk, Portsmouth, Chesapeake and adjacent communities.





- The Senators successfully secured \$293,000 for the Paul D. Camp Community College in
 Franklin to establish, improve, and expand nursing and allied health programs, including by
 upgrading technology and purchasing equipment. These programs train workers needed to
 prevent, diagnose, and treat diseases and illnesses.
- The Senators successfully secured \$275,000 for a non-profit called Neighborhood in Chesapeake to expand its Career & Community Development Program, which trains unemployed and underemployed community members for meaningful jobs with sustainable living wages, by providing wraparound services, like career coaching and computer literacy skills.
- The Senators successfully secured \$197,000 for the Eastern Shore Foundation to support a prototyping and training center for advanced manufacturing in Northampton County. This would help train workers for jobs in local industries.
- The Senators successfully secured \$170,000 for ForKids, Inc. to support afterschool programming for students in kindergarten through fifth grade who are falling behind on academic milestones in Chesapeake City.
- The Senators successfully secured \$159,000 for the Eastern Shore Rural Health System to provide pediatric dental services in Northampton County.
