- The Senators successfully secured \$1,000,000 for James Madison University in Harrisonburg to support a partnership with public schools, medical institutions, and African American communities to address disparities in representation in health professions and in the health outcomes experienced in African American communities.
- The Senators successfully secured \$561,000 for Blue Ridge Hospice to expand access to highquality preventative, primary, acute and long-term care under its Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly in Winchester.
- The Senators successfully secured \$190,000 for Centra Health to purchase equipment to train health students in patient-centered practices and create a mentorship program to assist with student success in Lynchburg.
- The Senators successfully secured \$72,000 for the Shenandoah Valley Black Heritage Project to recover African American history and create a database of historic sites and burial grounds in the Shenandoah Valley. The data collected will be used to create 14 driving history tours accompanied with video and audio interviews from Valley residents, which will be freely available online.
